## Some important changes to your Freshwater Informer magazine!

ello and welcome to the April issue of the Freshwater Informer!

After an unsettled early March, our weather has begun to settle and become a little more Spring like which has been most welcome. Unfortunately, the rivers were high and very coloured at the start of March and only really fined down a week or so prior to the end of the season, typical!

Since the last issue of the magazine the world has gone rather crazy! The awful situation in Eastern Europe has had a ripple effect right through our very fabric of life and has avoided no one with its impact. We should consider ourselves fortunate in that we are 'only' moaning about the ever rising prices of simply everything we use or need and are not living in the war zone.

Unfortunately, the Freshwater Informer has also been dramatically affected by the current events. I work closely with my printers, the Wealden Group at Hawkhurst, and they are being hit with massive increases in the price of paper. Indeed, paper has become difficult to source at times! It seems that many paper producing companies have switched over to producing cardboard for Amazon!

So, what are the effects on the Freshwater Informer? The printers advised me that my print costs would rise by 30% each month. This is a massive hike for a free magazine that relies on advertising revenue as its sole income. If there was a cover charge, it would simply mean adding another 50p to the cost of the magazine. However, I do not have that option. The past couple of weeks have involved a lot of head scratching, calculations, meetings, phone calls, bouncing ideas off friends and family etc not to mention one or two nights where I would be up at 3am and sitting with my pen and paper trying to find a magical solution!

The result is fairly radical due to the amount of factors that needed to be considered. I did not want to pass on hefty advertising price increases to the magazine advertisers who are also under tight financial pressure. I looked again at the magazine content and the various sections and the advertising revenue each raises. The Sea Informer section has grown considerably over the past three years and requires between 8-10 pages per month to accommodate the reports and articles etc. However, the income from that section does not raise sufficient revenue to cover the production costs and so is subsidised by the other parts of the magazine. So, due to this imbalance, I have decided to remove the Sea Informer from the magazine and concentrate on the coarse, carp and trout content, in effect, the magazine is returning to its roots and where it all started way back in 1996! The saving from not having the sea content will 'pay' for the increased print cost.

I feel the above measures are the best compromise considering all the relevant factors involved and by taking this way forward it does not involve hefty price hikes for my advertisers yet still provides you, the reader, with all your favourite reading for FREE each month.

## **Fishery Reports**

#### **Beaver Fishery** Lingfield, Surrey

As we write this report for the past months catches, the weathermen are giving us four days of sunshine and a heady 15 degrees! With the small amounts of sun we've had to date the fish are quickly responding to it by warming themselves up after another cold winter, ready to start feeding before spawning time once again. The Storm Eunice clear up is going well, with five of our lakes now completely fishable. Daughters has swims 1 & 2 shut due to a tree in the lake and Majors also has two swims shut due to a tree in the lake and we are currently working on this lake giving it an after winter tidy up. Maze has a couple of swims fishable, but as yet we haven't started to tidy up the branches and fallen trees.

Snipe Lake fished well over the past month, with both Originals and Stockies gracing the bank. Well done to the following anglers on banking themselves a fish or two. Scott Carter had a great birthday session, landing Mirrors of 21-00, 24-00 and the Queen of the lake, Hayley's Mirror at a healthy 37-00. Sam Sutton managed the 'High Back' Mirror at 27-08. First timer on Snipe, Grant Simmons, banked two Mirrors at 25-08 & 28-00. Ian York kept his run going by netting a 20-10 Common and a new **PB** with a 25-00 Mirror. **Ed Rayner** landed the biggest Common of the year so far with the 'Golden Common' at 32-00. Jack Beer banked a 23-08

Mirror. Tony Rogers had a 20-01 Mirror on a day session. Al Randall landed the 'Black Scar' Mirror at 26-01. Micky Lowe had his first Snipe Carp, with two Mirrors weighing in at 22-00 & 23-01. Mickey Sugrue managed a 23-08 Mirror on his first visit to us. Gerry Fowler netted a 22-08 Mirror. Gavin Bryant had a blinding overnight session by banking 3 fish, all Mirror's at 20-03, 21-00 & 23-00, Mick Box got off the mark for 2022 with a 22-02 Mirror. Liam Hall was back after nearly a year away and managed a 15-02 Common

and a scalev 19-08 Mirror. Last of all Christian Strebinger banked his first Snipe Carp with the 'Big Lin' at 25-14. Westlake Being a deep lake, Westlake takes a bit longer to start warming up

so the Cats can still be hard going at this time of year. Recently, there was a 48 hour window where it looked like they had started to wake up as a couple of anglers got lucky by banking a few fish. Pete Ellis got up and running for the year with a 47-00. **Mark Slade** set the bar high when he banked 4 fish including a 55-08 & a 72-11. Darren Evens landed a 41-00. Also a few doubles and 20's were landed before the feeding spell stopped.

Jeffs Lake is the most consistent pond on the complex being that it's fished throughout the winter. Plenty of F1's and Bream being banked on method feeder tactics. Pole and maggot fishing is producing non stop smaller Skimmers, Roach, Perch and Gudgeon. One of the best days reported was by **Dave Horsley** landing 23 fish, mainly F1 Carp and a couple of decent Bream.

Moat Pond Moat Pond hasn't seen many anglers over the past month, which in turn has made the fishing a bit hit and miss. Small Carp are being caught, along with Bream and Silvers. Most anglers are banking two or three carp, with a couple having really good days. The best report was from Jason Hills who managed 12 Carp, 2 F1's and a Bream in an afternoon's fishing.

Daughters Lake is always tough going, not being helped by the lack of anglers giving it a go and bait being applied. We have already started dying the water to try and inhibit the algae growth. With the new

oxygenation system working each night, the oxygen levels will hopefully be a bit more stable throughout the coming Spring and Summer. **Richard Wetton** decided to give it ago and banked a 12-08 Common. Darren Giffen had a great 24hrs, landing Mirrors of 11-10 & 14-02 plus a PB 25lb+ Grass Carp. Craig Clayton was happy he fished a day session when he managed a 15-08 Common and a new lake record Grass Carp at 26-02 which saw him win our Fish of the Month competition for February.

**Eden Pond** through the colder months no one fishes Eden Pond, with anglers waiting for Spring and Tench time. The first angler on there this year was Jacob Pierce and he had one bite and landed a nice 5-09 Tench. Nigel Barrow gave it proper go and

timed it just right, banking 11 Tench, several decent Perch and a couple of


Maze Lake As we said at the start of this report, we haven't started to tidy up the storm mess on Maze Lake yet so very few anglers have fished it over the last month. Those that have, have been catching Bream, F1's and the odd small Carp. The best reported to us was again from **Dave Horsley** who banked 12 F1's, 3 small Carp a 6 decent Bream.



Majors Lake has started to wake up over the past few weeks with Bream to

7-08, Carp to 22-08 and even a couple of Tench to 4-06. Terry Edwards has continued his mini campaign on there fishing days and managing 6 Carp between 8-00 and 12-08, plus a bonus 12-08 Pike on a pop up. **Colin Spires** netted his first Carp of 2022 with a 14-08 Ghost Common. Luke Pickett nicked a 10-04 Mirror on a very short stalking session. Craig Clayton gave Majors a go for a change and banked a small Common and 5 decent Bream. The Pike season has been very tough again this year, so Gareth Osmond was happy with a 16-08 and Norman Epps



#### Robin Piper put pen to paper and sent me this letter:

"Dear Barry, When I was working for the Royal Mail we had a fishing group consisting of two teams of six and competed against other depots. Our matches were held during the season on the River Thames from Richmond to Chertsey. We had one match a month through the Autumn, none in December due to the Christmas pressure, but would then resume in January.

The last match would be the final at Laleham. Most, if not all of the catches, were of skimmers, roach and gudgeon and we fished with open ended feeders with a screw in swing tip. Who fishes with one of those today! However, it worked ok as long as the tip was out straight.

Maggots were the 'in bait' with breadcrumb to mix and there were some nice bags of fish caught as I remember, but as much as our team tried we generally picked up the 'wooden spoon' for the best 'tryers'! On all the matches our team had the lowest weights and the amount of time we sat waiting for that swing tip to straighten out. In those days no one had bivvies, buzzers or did anyone use a catapult as the tidal Thames was constantly moving up and down so the bait was always going to end up in another swim. There was no real skill involved in those days, you just hoped that you was going to have a good day!

The rest of the year saw some of us fish from the tow path near Kingston Bridge. I used to like to fish a feeder under the first arch and wait for a pull round on the tip. We did have some good fish at times. We also used to

like to fish by the warm water outlet near the power station on the other side of Kingston Bridge just a short distance

downstream. You could see all the silver fish turning in the water so I would set up a small waggler and often would pick up some good roach and bream. They were good days and you were not bothered too much as you were enjoying yourself.

I returned there only last Summer to that very section where I used to fish long ago and saw just two anglers. Very sad that so few fish this lovely stretch of water. When we had our matches there we had a walk off as all the London staff and offices competed and picked out a number from 1 to well over 100! Unfortunately, nowadays the roads in the area have double yellow lines, permit parking, limited parking etc If you can find parking it is in a multi-storey!

Apart from that some very good memories from the 'old days' which I cherish!" Regards, Robin Piper

**Speci 1** This lake has been proving challenging at times with the weather being so up and down, but, those that are up for a challenge, have been rewarded with a couple of fish. Solid pva bags over a small bed of particle has seemed to be the winning ways of getting a few fish out. Andy Humphreys has been at it again and managed some lovely fish.

Speci 2 Catfish have started to wake up with the warmer weather settling in and one of our regulars, **Anthony Hildige**, managed to get a 41lbs **PB** which was one of 7 fish in 48hrs. Soft baits seem to be working at the moment like luncheon meat and worms. Carp are being caught on small baited areas fishing bottom baits or pop-ups and don't forget your solid pva bags.

**Heron** A lovely mixed coarse lake that has been very popular with the regulars catching a lovely mixed bag of fish with the odd chance of catching a good size carp up to 15lbs, average carp being caught are between 6-7lbs. Large mixed bags of fish are being caught now that the weather is warming up.

**Kingfisher** This is an overstocked match lake and great fun with a guarantee of catching, brilliant for families or anyone wanting to teach their kids how to fish. Stay away from boilies in here and use natural baits like maggots, corn, pellets, worms on a light float fishing setup.

**Bluebell** A little tench pond tucked out of the way, this pond is showing a good number of tench being caught on float or feeder tactics using worm, maggot, paste or sweetcorn on the hook. The carp in here are also stunning fish that can be caught up to 10lbs with also the odd roach, rudd and gudgeon.








## Going full circle!

couple of weeks ago I leant over the railings of the small bridge crossing the tiny Scottish Burn at Kinloss on the Moray Firth and the memories from fifty years ago came flooding back. I am a great believer that life is all about creating and remembering fantastic memories and this spot was where I first ever fished and I still remember it so clearly. This peaty little flow was where my brother, Andy, and I tried enthusiastically to catch the little red bellied sticklebacks from the



depths and when the first one was hooked the excitement was incredible. Fishing still makes me feel that way to this day.

In remembering those formative years, and seeing my first ever 'swim' after so long, really set my mind into thinking of all of my

In remembering those formative years, and seeing my first ever 'swim' after so long, really set my mind into thinking of all of my angling memories and how much I actually enjoyed catching little fish on balanced gear where even the smallest fish still gave the line a tug and sent the heart thumping with excitement. I have bounced all over the sport of angling from boats in Bermuda to carping in South Africa, but so many happy memories have been actually catching the smallest fish, where in more recent years I have become somewhat fixated on the larger fish, especially carp. Don't get me wrong, I love fishing for all and everything, but shouldn't I travel back in time to where it all started, with tiny fish, to see if it still had the same effect?

Of course, I had now set myself a challenge and my darling wife, Tini, and my boys bought me a beautiful Drennan float rod which would work perfectly for targeting small fish, but still able to give me the thrill of playing and landing. In truth, fishing gear, across all sectors, has become much heavier than what my generation

was introduced to, where balanced gear was matched up to the tactics and target species whilst still allowing you to really enjoy yourself even when you land the tiniest of fish.

I think LRF (Light Rod Fishing) reinforces this, which is a style of fishing that is gaining traction now in the UK, having come from countries like Japan where it is mainstream. The angler is using the lightest of gear to catch, for example, small sea fish, where in reality you would have never detected the bite and certainly not enjoyed the fight. A 4ozs pollack can give a real true account of itself and the bite detection on 3lbs braid really opens your eyes to how many bites we are missing on heavier and, therefore, less sensitive gear. It really is something to appreciate within your angling that bite detection can be a major flaw especially within modern trends like alarms which can give you false indications born from assumptions!

After what seems like weeks of wet and miserable weather, I had decided to sneak off for a few hours as soon as the sun popped out. I had chosen a local lake that I know contains some pretty roach and they were going to be my target fish, anything else a bonus. Bait preparation is always high on my list of priorities so the hook bait on my light float set up was to be what must be one of the most successful, the humble red maggot. But with water temperatures still nigh on





'baltic', I had prepped my groundbait mix up to really be active and potent to not only 'shout out', but also to instigate fish into feeding.

For me, my mixes must always contain proper food ingredients alongside 'extras' that would create the reaction I was looking for and so my Daphnia and Maggot Crush was cut with our small 2mm Coarse Pellets and a healthy dash of Maggot Powderz. This granulated powder is 100% maggot and really is a powerful enhancer. Finally, was the addition of dried Gammarus Shrimp. A great food source for fish, which contains air within their structure. Once you make the mix up and it hits the deck of your swim, the air filled Gammarus Shrimp start to 'fight' its way out of the mix and, therefore, even in the coldest and most sterile water conditions, you can still create a cloud of attraction throughout the water columns.

Conditions were not ideal with the bright sunlight and the wind was really getting on for storm force, but the swim was selected and my float cast out over a bed of my ground bait. To be fair, this mix is so consistent and it was only a few minutes before the float jigged and disappeared and I tightened into the first roach of many that visited the bank over the next three hours. They were mint, like they had just been printed and I started to appreciate something that I had been overlooking for far too long. These little fish were beautiful, fun to catch and just reinforced that I should really embrace such sessions again and



not just travel the same path of specimen hunting. It was genuinely three hours of my childhood revisited and I really had forgotten how obsessive it was to watch for that bite from my small red tipped float.

I just kept on getting bites and, therefore, kept on feeding little and often, keeping the shoal interested but not overfeeding. The only other species that wandered into my swim was a tiny skimmer, again in absolutely mint condition as I held it in my hand and studied instead of just popping it back, which I probably would have normally done.

Needless to say, I have my 'mojo' back to fish this way far more often and as the weather warms up other species will come onto my radar, it really is a case of watching this space!





## The Golden Years of Coarse Fishing

by Bob Rolph

## The former huge roach of the London reservoirs - PART TWO

Last month Bob took a look back at the London reservoirs and the angling opportunities they offered. In the second part of this informative article, Bob takes a closer look at some of the fishing he enjoyed in those Golden Days!



Two shillings and sixpence was all that was needed for a day's fishing, payable on the day to the resident official in the office on site at 8am sharp! It was first come, first served for the day ticket plus possession of a valid river board licence, as now, was required. In those days each Water Board issued their own Rod licences and this was a pain if you travelled the country and had to get a ticket first. The advent of the National Rod Licence by the Environment Agency was a Godsend in 1975! At the time you couldn't fish before 8am and had to be off the water by sunset, so off we went to explore this new fishing venue, 7 of us if I remember correctly, armed mainly with loaves of bread, maggots and worms.

With very little advanced knowledge of how to tackle this huge expanse of water, rumour had it that fishing at long range with punched bread flake on the bottom was the method the London boys had been using at Staines. I knew Peter Butler well, even been to his house at Colindale, but he was reluctant to let on too much about their baits and methods, other than what he had published in the Fishing Magazines! All he told me was that bites were hard to hit at such long range and to be patient!

We plumped first for the No 1 Reservoir which was nearest to the car park at the foot of the long flight of steps leading up to the water's edge. The banks were difficult for fishing with just a narrow ledge below a


5ft retaining wall. Any sort of bank stick or rod rest was out of the question on the solid concrete

banks, so I developed a wooden tripod rod rest


which fitted the bill exactly. Casts of over 50 yards or more with bread on a size 8 hook and Arlesey bomb lead, fished in about 15 foot of water, was the chosen method to start with, but bites were difficult to detect, fishing as we always did into the wind on the North side of the reservoir.

It took us several trips in the Autumn of 1965 before we hit the jackpot and began to catch big roach on a regular basis. Fishing in a row, like matchmen, the bites came as the roach shoals moved along from right to left and many a time we all had fish on one after another. The gently sloping concrete banks proved difficult, but 2lbs + roach started to grace our nets on a very regular basis. Keepnets, I believe, were banned, so photos of more than a brace of fish at a time were rare, but we did manage several hundred good fish up to 2lbs 12ozs over the three years that we fished there, mainly in the Autumn months. Grahame Igglesden and Brian Hepple both had the biggest fish and I had them to 2lbs 4ozs. We photographed them as we could up on the grass walkways between the reservoirs, and I subsequently wrote about it all in Creel magazine just before it folded in about 1968.

The late Peter Butler and his group became good friends, and we fished together on several occasions on the Royalty, but their catches at Staines beat us kids from Kent hands down once all the secrecy died down, and our true catches were revealed. There was a great deal of friendly rivalry between the various groups and secrecy was paramount at the time, least swims, baits and venues were revealed! Just like today, no doubt, with the carp!



Roach are on the up again with some great fish reported from our lakes, rivers and reservoirs again after a bit of a lull. At my local lake in Chilham, the roach are growing fast and provide me with great sport on light float tackle with maggots or sweetcorn. The demise of the fishing, and those great anglers that fished at the time, are sad to reflect on, but their memories live on in the great books and articles that so many of them left behind. Book reflections are being published



every month and one of the latest is that of the great countryman and angler Fred J.Taylor. I will be reviewing 12 of the best books in time for next Christmas, most of which are published by The Little Egret Press, they are all very limited edition hardbacks, so you better get in quick if you want a copy! The leather collectors' copies are the most expensive and they are the copies that always go first!

There are now so many serious collectors of hardback specialist fishing books that they either buy to resell at a later date or collect in huge libraries covering whole walls. I have several friends who have collections of over one thousand with a value into tens of thousands of pounds! Some buy two copies, one to read and one to keep in mint form, to appreciate in value. We are talking several hundred pounds for a rare



limited edition work by a sought after angler! Try finding a copy of 'A Carp Water' by BB for under £400, just a slip of a book, but very rare, or Confessions of a Carp Fisher in mint condition for less than £300. First editions are essential, but need to be in mint condition. I once found a copy at a boot fair in Sevenoaks for £4! It now takes pride of place amongst my collection of

400 books. Catch a Big Fish by David Carl Forbes is another if you can find one, worth £200 at least. Never lend books to other old fishermen, I'm still missing Jim Gibbinson's 'Carp', a first edition and signed, worth £150 if it's a penny!


Another point worth noting is to get them signed by the authors at a book signing or book fair, but not simply "To Fred", Best fishes, Dick Walker. Some line up to get each chapter signed by the respective author at the head of the page. It's supposed to enhance the value, but I'll never know as I never sell any of mine! My family will be able to tell you at the end of the day, as long as they don't let the house clearance people in! Go to specialist dealers in Hay-on-Wye, or the like, there are many about, or best advertise online after having first looked up the likely price range for its condition. Condition is paramount and it must be a genuine First Edition, not from a book club!



This was a potentially serious pollution of the river as the volume of the dumped oil was considerable. It does appear though that it seems to have been a lucky escape as far as the riverside life was concerned with a number of swans and waterfowl having to be cleaned up, but, little sign of fish losses as far as I am aware at the moment. Following the fly tipping of this oil into a ditch in the area, a substantial amount of it found its way into the river at the Yalding Marina. As reported last month, the EA were fortunately able to attend fairly quickly and prevent the majority of this oil getting out onto the main stream. This could have been much worse and it definitely should serve as a warning to all of us to watch out for this type of illegal activity and have the EA 'Hotline' number 0800 807060 on speed dial in your phone.

On the fishing front, I have just concluded my Pike fishing for the winter and will now be switching my attention to the Tench in particular, but also some decent bream that I started to pursue last summer. I am off to a slow start on this campaign however and

the first couple of sessions proved to be pretty grim with the only excitement being the odd invasion of my margin float swim by carp. Not that I mind doing battle with big carp on my 1 1/4lb twelve footer and centerpin combination, but it does disturb my tench fishing! The truth is though that you can only catch what is there and the fact that the carp are showing interest in my tactics shows that it is just a matter of time before I get into the tench again.

The Bream are a different proposition however and most of my catches in recent years have come on feeder tactics, at some distance, and last summer I started using some jumbo feeders constructed from large hair curlers. I think that I did feature them in this column at some stage and I had been particularly successful with a floating version of these that I was using for the roach on one

of the more weedy waters.

The whole idea of feeder fishing is basically to deliver a small pile of freebies / groundbait to your chosen area in an accurate and attractive way and I class PVA bags etc, as part of these tactics as it is still the best method of presenting a small patch of larger baits, such

as boilies, around your hookbait. Although my standard approach to this type of fishing is to combine it with a number of balls of groundbait, put out into the same area, it is also the case that it works well enough without this addition, when you want to keep disturbance to a minimum. It is still a lot better than a single hookbait for creating a bit of instant interest, especially if you are on a new patch and are not really sure where to cast. I am really looking forward to this Spring and Summer's fishing and I am already enjoying being out and

about on the bankside and watching / welcoming all the returning birds and other wildlife and, of course, also observing their relative numbers, often, it has to be said, with some concern.

I have been asked frequently how I am progressing with the new book and the answer is OK, I am getting there. The content of this one has now become a combination of two Ideas. Following the publication of my first book 'Carping Aside', I had always planned to do a second one pretty well

along the same lines. Unfortunately, I became rather disillusioned with the whole publishing process and the way that I had been treated by the Publisher. Not that I was the only one to get shafted, in fact the whole business ended in court action which may even still be going on! I always want to avoid this sort of scenario, where possible, and prefer to reserve such actions

as a last resort. The second Idea is one that I have always had is about doing a 'Medway Man' book loosely based on the same format as this column with stories and tales of my fishing activities along with some political comment about current affairs and issues on the fishing scene. The book will contain a full account of my current attitudes towards Angling and various other happenings that have greatly concerned me recently. I understand that certain people are not looking forward to this publication - I wonder why?

#### Hello and welcome to the April edition of Junior Informer!

I cannot believe that Easter is almost upon us! I am sure you are all looking forward to a couple of weeks off and the chance to get out and do some fishing. At the time of writing, the weather is looking very settled with warm sunny days, but cool nights and the chance of frost. The cold nights don't help with water temperature, but the fish are now waking up and responding to the sunshine during the day and the longer daylight hours. They certainly sense that the seasons are changing and are coming out of their winter slumber!

The rivers are now closed for fishing until June, but our region has a huge variety of great lakes that offer many kinds of different fishing. Have a look through the magazine to decide where you would like to fish next! Wherever you are in the South East there is a water within a short drive of your town or village. Even though the days are getting warmer, the water will take a lot longer to warm up so it is worth bearing that in mind when baiting up. I would suggest that you remain cautious when introducing feed in to your swim. Put in small amounts to begin with and when you are confident the fish are feeding you can then gradually introduce a little more. Very often a swimfeeder approach is a great starting point as you are only feeding small amounts of food through the feeder rather than balling in a larger amount. Try and get in to the habit of casting your feeder every few minutes rather than cast it and leave it for ages. Bites generally come very quickly to a baited feeder and carp are attracted to the sound of the feeder hitting the water and will come and investigate. By casting to the same spot each time, your chances of catching are greatly increased so casting practise is essential for hitting that same spot every time.

Give it a try! Enjoy your fishing, Barry Reed



# season tactics

Early spring and the water's still cold at 6 degrees. With minimal fly hatches I'm not expecting any surface activity. I select a slow sinking intermediate fly line that sinks at around 1 to 1.5" per sec; this allows me to systematically dissect the water's layers, slowly. Using this line allows me to use unweighted flies which are more mobile and agile in the water than weighted versions. I angle my casts along the bank, this means my flies are in the shallower margins for most of the retrieve, an area where food accumulates and multiplies early in the season. I slowly use a figure of eight retrieve, occasionally speeding up before pausing in an effort to trigger a take. Finally, as the line approaches my casting position, I stop the retrieve and gently lift the rod in an effort again to trigger a take as my flies change direction and rise up towards the surface. I pause as my rod reaches the eleven o'clock position, the hang is so important especially early in the season when the water's cold because the fish are cold and slow moving too. The hang induces takes from fish that wouldn't take on the retrieve, but, you have to be very attentive as takes are very subtle. It's essential to watch your leader and dropper flies at this point, sometimes the leader looks too tight or at too steep an angle, lift sharply now and you'll be surprised how often you've connected with a fish! If nothing's there then just roll your line off the surface and start your next cast, no harm done.

**Now the fishing** I recently fished Chequertree, Bethersden TN26 3JR [01233-820078]. It was a beautiful crisp, cold cloudless morning. With blue skies and bright sunshine it was hardly optimum conditions to catch trout, but any opportunity is worth taking, you can't catch them sitting at home! My game plan was to cast along the margin and when possible aim casts towards the adjacent margin putting my flies in two "high percentage" areas. The lake at Chequertree has a shallow marginal shelf that is very narrow, maybe only half a rod length wide before dropping into deeper water. I've noticed on previous visits that the fish often patrol along this shelf so it pays to stand back from the water's edge. My parallel casts were aimed over the shelf into deeper water. I employed the slow retrieve and hang approach while using a "mid-glass" intermediate line that sinks at 1" per second. My team of flies were as follows; unweighted damsel - point, black marabou tailed Diawl Bach - middle, and peach marabou tailed orange nymph - top.

After a few speculative casts gradually going deeper and slower each time, I finally got a response. I was about to execute the "lift" at the end of the retrieve when I felt a gentle pluck that at first I thought was my fly pinging off a reed stalk. But when it happened again I instinctively lifted and made contact with a very heavy fish that hugged the bottom all the way into the margin before powering off towards the middle of the lake. I quickly reeled up the loose line so there was no danger of getting it under my feet. I prefer to play fish off the reel whenever possible; you can apply far more controlled pressure using the reels smooth drag system. After a period of stalemate I turned the fish and slowly applied more pressure gaining line as I did, gradually I could see the line lift towards the surface. Finally, I got my first glimpse of a large brown trout that had taken the Diawl Bach. The water was clear enough to see every black spot



along its broad flanks followed by an impressively large paddle tail. As I squatted down to net my prize, I was already thinking of the beautiful picture it would make, when I had that sickening feeling as the hook hold gave way, doh! I dropped my rod and walked away in an effort to calm myself down. Long range releases are never good, but fortunately I'd seen this magnificent creature, and so it was no surprise when Chris, the fishery owner, confirmed he'd stocked a few large browns to around 8lbs, which confirmed my 'guestimate'.

After that it was rather an anti-climax, although I did catch several rainbows including a blue trout. Blues are a strain of rainbow that can be distinguished by their grey-blue back; they fight harder and swim much higher in the water than rainbows for some reason. Most of my fish came within a few feet of the marginal shelf as my flies slowly edged their way up the slope towards the surface. My top dropper fly, which was visible first, caught most fish as they mooched along the bank. If I'm honest losing that brownie did take the edge off what was otherwise a very successful day.

**Lakedown** A break in the weather saw my first visit of the year to Lakedown Trout Fishery, Burwash TN21 8UX [07502] 257428]. Yet another cold start and as always the puzzle to solve was how deep were the fish going to be? It's interesting how differently fish behave at different fisheries. I'm a victim of my own wanderlust, rarely visiting the same water twice in quick succession. It's surprising how shallow the fish often are even in the depths of winter. We might be chilled to the bone, but the trout revel in these conditions. As I sat drinking tea in the lodge with fishery legend Ted Cocklin I could see trout breaching the surface in the calm water. So fairly shallow looked likely, however, as soon as the breeze picked up they quickly disappeared! With plenty of fish in all the lakes, I planned to make things interesting by trying to catch fish from each of the four lakes. I walked down the valley to Lake 4, the furthest from the lodge. I usually fish from the dam, but, by now, the breeze had turned into a

strong wind and was buffeting me too much for safety. I moved to a point that allowed me to cast down and across the wind. I was using a "fast glass" intermediate sinking line that sinks at 1.5" per sec to cut under the surface drift. My fly of choice, only single flies allowed at Lakedown, was a hot head damsel nymph, no time to be subtle in these conditions. I varied my count down between 10, 15 and 20 seconds, as well as mixing the retrieve speed. Success came guickly and a feisty rainbow came barrelling towards me at speed shedding the barbless hook as it slack lined me! Never mind I thought, this won't take long, another fish a few casts later, but this fish stayed at range doggedly shaking its head from side to side, with the same result! Two lost fish, I had to check the hook's point, it seemed ok, but I had to change the fly just in case. I now selected a Fulling Mill Kingfisher Damsel, I like this slimmer blue flash damsel pattern with its blue bead head. Fortunately the fish do too and I quickly got off the mark, the fish all took at a count of 15 seconds on a very slow figure eight retrieve with frequent pauses, so I'd estimate the taking depth at around 3-5ft.





On to Lake 3 and I fished a deep area I know that always holds fish, but I couldn't buy a take. I tried going deeper, then faster, then deeper and faster, but nothing worked! Lakedown regular Giles Ellis was fishing opposite me using a floating line and was struggling too which made me feel a little better. I switched to a floater and started casting along the shallow reed lined edges, but still nothing happened until I sped up and promptly missed a take! Next cast, I hooked a fish on the damsel nymph, but yet again it came off! This is indicative of how newly stocked fish behave as they adjust to their new environment. No longer being fed pellets they need to find a new food source and so the mouthing, almost tasting of flies without taking them confidently is an early season phenomenon I've experienced before. After a lunch break I moved across the lake to the point Giles had vacated. I put a gold headed Apps bloodworm on the floater, casting across the wind and allowed it to sink into the deep hole, as the fly swung around on the breeze the line tightened and I lifted into a fish

On to Lake 2 which is my favourite on the fishery and I chose to fish across the

finger bay which was at the bottom end of the wind where the fish should be. Casting across the wind towards the far margin has brought me

success on previous trips so I started off using this tactic. No takes on various flies and retrieves so I had to move. I also changed to an unweighted UV Diawl Bach cast across the wind and allowed to drift with the wind. Shortly after the line drew tight and I'd caught a fish using a favourite method of basically doing nothing! I spooned this fish, as I had the others, but this fish was stuffed with food in the form of Daphnia.

Daphnia are sensitive to light and stay deep in sunlight, but move towards the surface in dull overcast conditions. Daphnia appears in vast clouds, these small water fleas are the freshwater equivalent of plankton, a nutritious food source, small in size maybe, but available in huge quantity and the trout love them. We know that flies with accents of orange, coral, pink or even chartreuse are very effective when trout are Daphnia feeding. Finally I arrive on Lake 1 full of confidence, with the light fading fast with the gathering clouds. The wind is blowing into the dam where I'm fishing, but fortunately I'm afforded some shelter by a copse of trees. It doesn't take me long to get my next fish, casting at an angle across the wind I let the line trundle along towards the dam while I just keep in contact taking up the slack. The takes, when they come, are very confident and I'm enjoying the action so much I elect to stay longer and catch a couple more. All are stuffed to the gills on the little water fleas!


